The school implements the extensive Curriculum which is set out by the Department of Education and Skills. This is a child centred, integrated curriculum. The intellectual and creative talents of the pupils are developed in various ways through the curriculum and educational tours as well as artistic, cultural and recreational activities which are organised in all classes. Extensive use is made of the modern audio-visual equipment and other teaching aides in the classroom.

Special Education:

Feakle National School prides itself on its inclusiveness, and we endeavour to cater for the needs of every child under our care. Our special education department provide comprehensive programmes to children of diverse abilities.

Music Generation Programme:

Feakle National School has always been renowned for its love of music and singing. Music plays an integral part of our concerts, Masses and liturgical celebrations.

School Garden:

We have a school garden where we sow flowers, potatoes and vegetables. Each class is responsible for their own part of the garden and take part in the sowing and reaping.

All children are encouraged to explore their potential with excellent results.

Computers:

Feakle National School is a multimedia learning environment. Each classroom is equipped with teacher laptops and interactive whiteboards. The school has a mobile laptop station with 20 laptops for pupil use, which can be moved around to each classroom as required. This allows the pupils to engage with learning in all curricular areas using a "hands on" approach.

Arts and Crafts:

Creative areas explored include painting, drawing, printing, pottery and marbling. The children love to use our fully equipped kitchen to cook and bake.

Physical Education:

We have a comprehensive physical education programme. We are involved in hurling, camogie, football, rugby, swimming and athletics. We have a well-equipped school hall, as well as a marked playground and use of the G.A.A. pitch beside the school. Throughout the year we benefit from specialised coaching in hurling and also travel to a leisure centre for swimming classes.

Book Rental Scheme:

We operate a Book Rental Scheme whereby the children can rent readers, text books and a selection of workbooks for a quarter of the retail price. This enables us to keep the overall price of the book list as low as possible. It also equips the school with a selection of old text books which are available to the pupils to use when studying specific topics.



Savings Scheme:

We have a post office savings scheme in operation in our school and the pupils are encouraged to save on a weekly basis for a variety of school activities including school tours.
