General Information

- Scoil Mhuire is a mixed, multi-grade rural school.
- The school building was opened in the 1960s with a large, modern extension completed in 2010.

- It is a superb facility It is completely enclosed with an overhead net and side fencing.






Outdoor Garden

As it is the intention of the school to maximise the potential of each of the pupils, we endeavour, within our resources, to meet these needs.



As well as in class differentiation of work, pupils with Special Educational Needs may receive support in Literacy and Numeracy through one to one support from the SET or within small groups with the SET.

Our SET also provides in-class support to pupils. We aim to minimise the withdrawal of pupils from their mainstream class.
